If an application is submitted without meeting these requirements it will not be made valid and you will be informed that you have 21 days to provide the necessary information before it is withdrawn.

NB – The information requirements in the tables do not limit the Council's ability to request additional information in the event that it is found to be necessary during the application's determination period.

Duty Planner Service
