It is proposed to expand Watergate School to cope with the demand for special needs places.

The existing School is hemmed into its site and cannot be practically expanded due to the existing houses at either side of the School.

To create space for the new School building, we are proposing to move the Dumps Adventure Playground and provide new play equipment and a new Multi-use games area (MUGA) on the current playing field, and to expand the site that the Youth Centre can use with a new Natural Play area.

- HabitatsMud KitchenForest School










Our site plan reveals the inclusion of a fresh community use Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA). We are confident that this addition will enhance the utilisation of the current playing fields, addressing concerns raised by the Youth Centre regarding the infrequent usage due to the existing pitch being uneven and often waterlogged. The MUGA will offer an accessible hard surface, enabling its utilisation by Watergate SEN school, accommodating individuals with mobility aids and wheelchairs and allowing a wide range of sports to be played by young people in the School and wider community.













FIRST FLOOR





KEY FEATURES:

1. A new one-way route will be provided through the site exiting onto Sedgehill Road to alleviate traffic on Oakview Road during pick up/drop off times.

GROUND FLOOR

2. A new 2-storey School building:

Ground Floor will have 8 SEN-specialist classrooms facing towards the existing School, with associated support spaces and new outdoor play spaces. First floor will accommodate specialised teaching spaces, dining and activity hall and staff areas. 3. The MUGA and Natural Play area will be securely accessed from the School building. These spaces will be shared between the School and the Dumps Youth Centre. The School will use these spaces during school hours, when the Youth Centre is not open.
